

COVID-19

This policy statement sets out Red7's response to the current outbreak of Coronavirus (COVID-19) but can be applied to any serious infectious disease pandemic that poses major health risks. It should also be considered in line with Red7's Business Continuity Policy and with the Company's Business Management system.

Red7 will frequently monitor the situation as nationally reported by Public Health England and follow Government guidelines and its associated departments and all of our operations shall be conducted in accordance with, or exceed the requirements of, all pertinent legislation and relevant industry guidance and good practice.

The Head Office team and office space is self-contained and not shared with other organisations, therefore wider contact with others during working hours is extremely low allowing social distancing recommendations to be met.

For site operations a thorough risk assessment is carried out and includes the risk of COVID-19 and additional safety measures and is communicated and agreed with all workers during daily briefings. As far as is reasonably practicable working away from home is discouraged however where this can not be avoided, there are safeguarding measures in place to ensure compliance with current guidelines.

Red7 acknowledges that workers will be both anxious and concerned at this time and at no point will they be pressurised to work in a situation they have concerns about.

The health and safety of Red7's workers is paramount and should any worker have or live with someone who has symptoms of the virus they must inform Red7 and follow the current guidance on action to take.

Red7 are committed to consultation and participation of workers and the workers representative and pride ourselves on our Health and Safety standards and expect and will ensure the same standards from others with whom we contract and interact.
